Students have varied opportunities in many different health care environments during their clinical practice in the program and, therefore, graduates of the program are prepared to begin employment in a variety of health care settings as entry level professional nurses.

- 1. Students requesting admission into the Nursing Program must submit a separate Supplemental I Applications will be accepted between January 1st and February 1st for Fall consideration and be 1 for Spring consideration. - 2. A GPA of 2.8 or better is required to enter the Nursing Program.
- 3. Students admitted to the nursing program must be 18 years of age or older before the first day of
- 4. All applicants must be eligible to enter college level Math and English courses as determined by Test, or have earned college level Math and English credit.
