<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>BUS 144 or BUS 146A &amp; B may be substituted. However, BUS 146 or BUS 146A/B are strongly recommended given their transferability into 4-year business programs.</li> <li>The 6 credits of BUS 178 Business Internship shall be taken over two semesters. BUS 285, Disney World Internship, is a 6 credit course taken in one semester.</li> <li>Students who wish to attend full-time while participating in the Disney World internship (BUS 285) have a choice of taking SUNY ADK online courses and/or traditional classroom courses at Disney (BUS 102, BUS 103 and BUS 141) which requires registering for a special section of SUNY ADK courses in addition to the 6 credit internship. Planning is essential for this internship – please see the Disney Coordinator as soon as possible for advisement.</li> <li>This program fulfills the majority of the SUNY Hospitality transfer path. Those students interested in transferring to a 4-year institution after completion of this program should seek advisement for additional course requirements.</li> </ol>
